The Intraocular Endoscopy is state-of-the-art equipment which allows surgeons to examine the retina and perform reconstructive surgery to correct vision disorders caused by injury, disease, scarring and failed corneal graft. It is also revolutionising the way surgery can treat abnormalities of the iris and lens due to congenital anomalies, injury, surgical complications, certain types of glaucoma...and much more.

> As Dr Mark Gorbatov, from the Vitreoretinal Group at the Sydney Eye Hospital explains, current techniques have their limitations.

"Usually, surgery inside the eye is performed by looking into the eye with a microscope through the dilated pupil," Dr Gorbatov says. "There are times when the cornea or other structures in the front parts of the eye are so severely affected by disease, injury or consequences of previous surgery that it is not possible to adequately see into the eye to make a diagnosis, let alone perform vitreoretinal surgery."

The Intraocular Endoscopy overcomes these problems by providing a tiny camera, together with a light, that produce pictures on a television screen to enable eye surgeons to see the previously hidden parts of the eye.

This new-generation equipment is truly revolutionising eye surgery – and with your help, patients of the Sydney Eye Hospital will soon have access to this cutting edge diagnostic tool.
